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STATEMENT BY THE CHIEF SECRETARY TO THE PRESIDENT AND CABINET ON ANNOUNCING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE PRESIDENTIAL ADVISORY COUNCIL (PAC): 30th JANUARY, 2019

Introduction

In order to ensure that Vision 2030 draws from a broad and diverse skills and expertise base, His Excellency the President, Cde Emmerson Dambudzo Mnangagwa, today announced the establishment of a Presidential Advisory Council (PAC). The Presidential Advisory Council, PAC, will serve as the President's sounding board on key economic reforms, issues and initiatives, in line with his **"Zimbabwe is Open for Business and Dialogue"** mantra, and also within the policy framework of the Transitional Stabilization Programme. It will be recalled that Vision 2030 is predicated on attracting domestic and foreign direct investments, and on transforming Zimbabwe into a business-friendly investment destination with a stable and supportive macroeconomic environment. To that end, His Excellency the President and his Government will need well-canvassed ideas, proposals and strategies to realize the Vision.

Terms of Reference

The Presidential Advisory Council which is voluntary and serves at the pleasure of His Excellency the President has the following as its terms of reference:

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1. From time to time to help with a comprehensive situational analysis on the state of the economy, and investment climate in the country;
2. To proffer ideas and suggestions on key reforms and measures needed to improve the investment and business climate in the country for economic recovery and growth;
3. To contribute towards policies and measures, short, medium and long term, for the growth of the economy;
4. On the strength of the country's resources, to suggest best strategies for leveraging them to best national advantage;
5. To advise and develop strategies for making Zimbabwe a modern, industrialized and food-secure, higher middle-income Nation by 2030;
6. To input into policies and strategies for Inclusive and Balanced Growth, in line with the policy on Decentralization and Devolution;
7. To advise on the integration of Science, Technology, Research and Innovation in the Economy;
8. To suggest infrastructural strategies and investments meant to transform Zimbabwe into a Land-Linked Regional Logistical and Trading Hub;
9. To conceive and develop strategies for transforming the economy into a manufacturing and trading hub;

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10. To advise on developing sector-by-sector strategic value-chains for the Economy which are linked to international markets;
11. To advise on National Energy Development strategy which makes Zimbabwe competitive;
12. To benchmark Zimbabwe on global best practices and ratings;
13. To suggest blueprints for regulatory frameworks and institutions for a modern, market-driven, business-friendly economy;
14. To advise on strategies for building strong and gainful global partnerships, as well as maximizing on Zimbabwe's bilateral and multilateral relations;
15. To proffer ideas of Building a Sovereign Wealth Fund; and to ensure that National growth and development strategies are built on environmental safeguards for future generations;
16. To organise Interactions between the President, Local and International Businesses;
17. To undertake any other duties and responsibilities which the Head of State and Government may assign.

Rules of Engagement

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- Quarterly brainstorming and/or feedback meetings with the President;
- Ad-Hoc meetings as and when necessary;
- Proffering honest and sincere advice; declaring own interests whenever necessary;
- Respecting rules of confidentiality and trust;
- Relating to Government structures and personages with respect and professionalism;
- Refraining from abusing proximity for unlawful and unethical ends;
- Ensuring that all advisory content generated and produced by PAC are a property of His Excellency the President who assumes automatic copyright.
